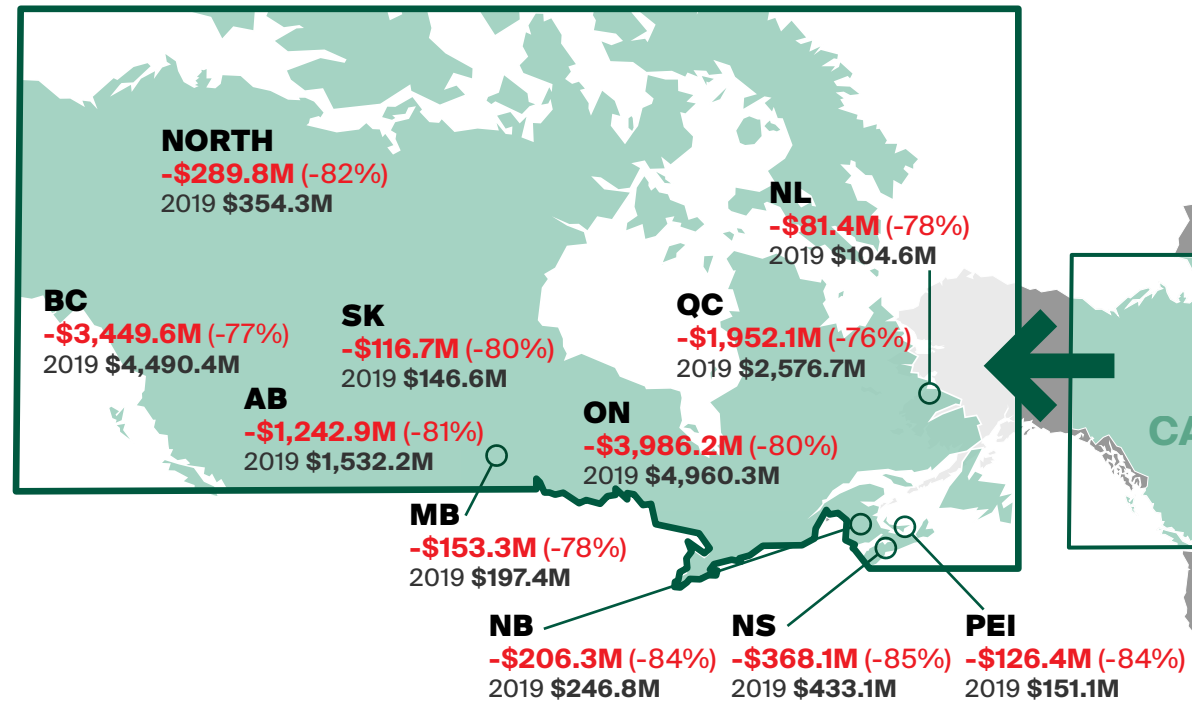

### UK

**I** COVID-19 Response - Government restrictions on movement and travel are gradually being lifted.

**299,600** ↑3%

### FRANCE

**II** Domestic - Government restrictions on movement and travel are gradually being lifted. Domestic travel within France is being considered and planned.

### GERMANY

**II** Domestic - Government restrictions on movement and travel are gradually being lifted. Domestic travel within Germany is being considered, planned, and booked.

### CHINA

**II** Domestic - Domestic travel within China is being considered, planned, and booked. Notably, Chinese tour operators are mandated to pause selling tours for international destinations.

### INDIA

**I** COVID-19 Response - Most government restrictions on movement have been lifted, but are now being reimplemented in some areas.

### S. KOREA

**II** Domestic - Domestic travel within South Korea is being considered, planned, and booked. However, some government restrictions are being re-established given a recent rise in the number of confirmed cases.

### JAPAN

**I** COVID-19 Response - Government emergency declarations have been lifted across all prefectures.

### AUSTRALIA

**II** Domestic - Government restrictions on movement and travel are gradually being lifted. Domestic travel within Australia is being considered and planned.

### US

**II** Regional - The US has moved to the Regional phase, and domestic travel within US is being considered, planned, and booked.

**I** COVID-19 Response - Government restrictions on movement and travel are gradually being lifted.
