No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for leisure travel

III Intra-Provincial 61.7

Alberta
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province; international travellers returning to AB at select borders may be eligible to engage in a pilot to quarantine for less time

II Hyper Local 77.2

Saskatchewan
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for leisure travel.

II Hyper Local 143.1

Manitoba
Residents returning from outside of the province for leisure travel must self-isolate for 14 days

II Hyper Local 62.9

Ontario
Residents returning from outside of the province for leisure travel are requested to self-isolate for 14 days

II Hyper Local 90.0

Quebec
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for leisure travel

II Hyper Local 104.4

New Brunswick
Residents returning from outside of the province for leisure travel must self-isolate for 14 days

II Hyper Local 16.9

Newfoundland and Labrador
Residents returning from outside of the province for leisure travel must self-isolate for 14 days

III Intra-Provincial 1.9

Prince Edward Island
Residents returning from outside of the province for leisure travel must self-isolate for 14 days

III Intra-Provincial 0.6

Nova Scotia
Residents returning from outside of the province for leisure travel must self-isolate for 14 days; exception for residents returning directly from Prince Edward Island or Newfoundland & Labrador
