Nunavut
Residents returning from NWT or Churchill, MB for domestic leisure travel are not required to self-isolate; those returning from all other parts of Canada who are not fully vaccinated must isolate for 14 days at designated sites

IV Inter-Provincial **0.0**

Northwest Territories
Fully vaccinated residents returning from outside of the territory for domestic leisure travel are not required to self-isolate, but testing for those arriving in smaller communities; those who are partially vaccinated must self-isolate for 8 days and those who are unvaccinated for 10 days

IV Inter-Provincial **0.0**

Yukon
Fully vaccinated residents returning from outside of the territory for domestic leisure travel are not required to self-isolate; 14 day self-isolation required for those who are not fully vaccinated

IV Inter-Provincial **97.5**

British Columbia
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for domestic leisure travel

IV Inter-Provincial **6.3**

Alberta
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for domestic leisure travel

IV Inter-Provincial **6.7**

Saskatchewan
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for domestic leisure travel

IV Inter-Provincial **14.7**

Manitoba
Fully vaccinated residents returning from outside of the province for domestic leisure travel are not required to self-isolate; 14 day self-isolation required for those who are not fully vaccinated

IV Inter-Provincial **19.9**

Ontario
Residents returning from outside of the province for domestic leisure travel are strongly advised to self-isolate for 14 days

IV Inter-Provincial **7.3**

Quebec
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for domestic leisure travel

IV Inter-Provincial **5.6**

New Brunswick
Residents returning from Atlantic provinces for domestic leisure travel are not required to self-isolate; those returning from all other parts of Canada who have not had at least one dose of vaccine are required to self-isolate for 5 to 7 days

IV Inter-Provincial **1.3**

Newfoundland and Labrador
Residents returning from Atlantic provinces for domestic leisure travel are not required to self-isolate; those returning from other parts of Canada who are partially vaccinated must present a negative test result and those who are unvaccinated must self-isolate for 14 days

III Intra-Provincial **5.9**

Prince Edward Island
Residents returning from Atlantic provinces for domestic leisure travel are not required to self-isolate if they have at least one vaccine dose and a PEI Pass; those returning from all other parts of Canada who are not fully vaccinated must self-isolate for 8 days.

III Intra-Provincial **0.0**

Nova Scotia
Residents returning from Atlantic provinces for domestic leisure travel are not required to self-isolate; those returning from all other parts of Canada who are partially vaccinated must self-isolate for 7 days and those who are unvaccinated for 14 days

IV Inter-Provincial **0.4**

Please note: An increase in search and bookings does not imply that residents are non-compliant with any current health restrictions in place, rather that there is an increased interest in travel. Actual travel could take place in the near future or at a later date.
